Ideas for Educational Speakers and Trips

Clubs are always looking for new ideas for fun and educational things to do. A great way to keep people engaged in 4-H and club activities is to host a speaker at a meeting or take a trip as a club.

In order to make sure that all members are included and engaged, it is good to incorporate a variety of areas of interest when scheduling speakers and trips. Maybe you can invite someone to speak to the club about meteorology and take a trip together to a local dairy farm. All members might not be equally engaged in each activity, but more members will have their interests met if you keep mixing it up.

Ask members and families if they have ideas for speakers or trips. Family members can be a great and accessible resource. Retirees are also great people to consider contacting. Many people are able to devote more time to a hobby or passion and are eager to share their knowledge. They may have a more flexible schedule, too. Local businesses and organizations are more often than not willing to help out groups that serve kids. It helps them spread awareness about what they do, and helps educate youth.

Keep these things in mind when trying to come up with educational opportunities for your club:

Get ideas from other clubs

Collaborate with other clubs to lower costs and spread knowledge

Look outside the county

Utilize club and community resources

And, most importantly:

Think outside the box

Don't be afraid to ask!

Learned about living in another country – contact high schools, colleges, or universities in the area to see if there are any exchange students who could come in and speak to your club about their home country.

Learned about model and remote-controlled airplanes – ask project leaders to present on their area of expertise or an area of interest.

Held a club picnic at a local park – try holding an outdoor meeting with games and/or hiking afterwards.

Learned about healthy eating – invite a dietician, or other health expert.

Toured a local manufacturing facility – learn how things we buy are made, at a local center of business.

Visited to the NEW Zoo in Suamico – look outside the county for interesting and fun trip ideas.


Went to the YMCA – check for group discounts at local places with great facilities.
