If an adult is only attending to be with a child, rather than to be enrolled, **please note that on the child's registration in the “Other” box.**

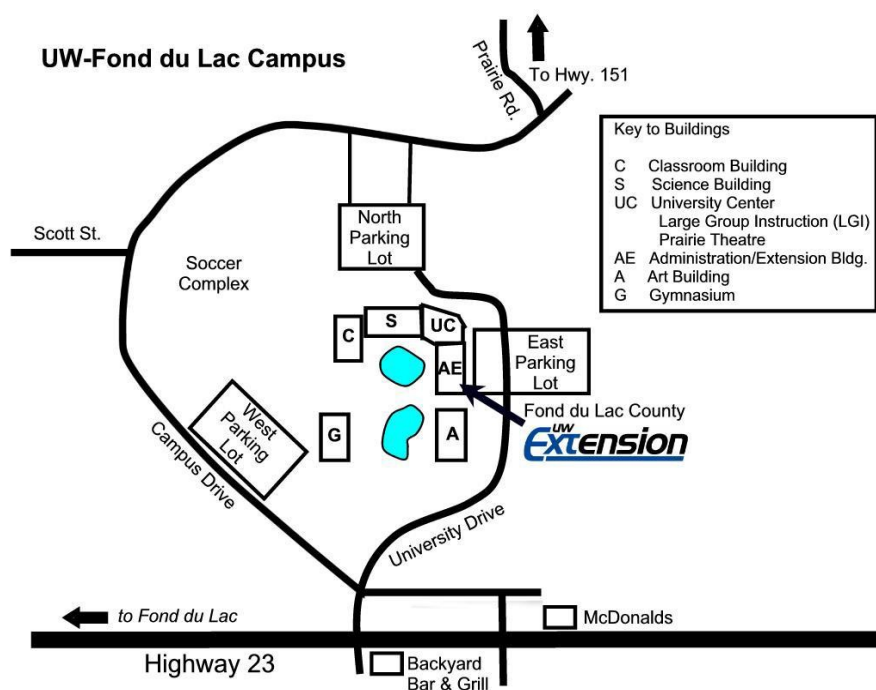
REFUND POLICY Refunds are given only in case of family emergencies. **Listen to KFIZ Radio** for weather cancellation.
