Volunteers Needed for Snapshot Wisconsin



[Snapshot Wisconsin https://dnr.wi.gov/topic/research/projects/snapshot/](https://dnr.wi.gov/topic/research/projects/snapshot/) is a statewide effort to engage volunteers and students in monitoring wildlife populations using trail cameras. Participants in the project help collect crucial information used for wildlife

management decision support at the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, all while capturing exciting photos of local wildlife!

Snapshot Wisconsin is now accepting trail camera host applications statewide! The requirements include basic computer skills and access to private or public land of at least 10 continuous acres, volunteers are asked to stay in the project for at least one year and check the camera at least once every three months. Join Junior Master Gardeners (JMG)

Looking for a free interactive, educational program for your child this summer? If you answered yes, then you'll want to check out UW-Extension's Junior Master Gardener (JMG) Program. It is a summer-long gardening/cooking program for youth, ages 8-12 years, that teaches them to "dig in the dirt", care for plants,




cook in the kitchen and eat healthy fruits and vegetables. Beyond gardening and cooking, your child will take field trips in the community, learn about insects and "dirt" from the experts, play fun games, and create lifelong friends (just to name a few.)

Sessions are held on variable dates from 4:00-5:30 during the school year, and then weekly from 1:00-2:30 during the summer. Youth that attend at least 5 consecutive sessions will receive a JMG t-shirt, a field trip and certificate of participation. The JMG season begins April 4, from 4:00-5:30 pm in the "Garden of Eatin'" gardens at the Extension building (UW-Fond du Lac, 400 University Drive). UW-Extension's Transition to Madison

The UW-Extension system is in transition. "We will now be known as University of Wisconsin-Madison Division of Extension. It is also appropriate to refer to our organization as UW-Madison Division of Extension, Division of Extension or simply Extension. Each County logo will be representative of the county for example: Extension Fond du Lac County. We expect to fully transition all faculty, staff, and all major operational aspects of Extension by July 1, 2019."



- If adults or youth need to take a really important phone call or send a really important text/message, please step out of the room and take the call/send the message. It is also polite to explain before a meeting starts if you are expecting a call.
- If you notice someone on a phone (especially a youth), please politely remind them that phones should not be on during meetings.

Dropping a Project

The last day to drop a project is Friday, April 5th. Send your name, club, and the name of the dropped project to the Extension Office. You need to write a brief note or send an email to Tina at tina.engelhardt@ces.uwex.edu. You should also inform your general leader, so they can update their records.

Insurance for 4-H Leaders

Fond du Lac County 4-H leaders are covered by a liability insurance policy. They are automatically covered under this policy if they are a registered 4-H leader, completed the Volunteer in Preparation process, and are acting within the scope of their volunteer role. This policy is secondary for personal liability coverage.

Cell Phones at Meetings

Lemonade Day

Targeting Life Skills

There is no better time to reflect on the life skills you have learned in 4-H than when applying for college scholarships! Here are a few you can apply for!

4-H College Scholarships Available

The 4-H Adult Leader Association and the Teen Leader Association each offer college scholarships. To be eligible, you must be or must have been a 4-H member, be a high school graduate this spring or in the past, and you must be attending or planning to attend college or a school of higher learning.



The **Thuerwachter College Scholarship** is for Fond du Lac County 4-H members who are attending UW-Madison. You must have been a member of Fond du Lac County 4-H for at least 4 years. You must be enrolled at UW-Madison this coming fall. It is open to all 4-Her's and 4-H Alumni. The different amounts that will be offered for the Thuerwachter scholarship are: one \$500 scholarship for short-course, three \$1,000 scholarships for attending UW-Madison for four years going for a B.A. or B.S. degree, and one \$1,000 scholarship for grad school. Preferred area of study is agriculture.

The Adult, Teen, and Thuerwachter Scholarships are all on one application. The form is available on the web at <http://fonddulac.uwex.edu/4h/awards-scholarships/>. **It is due to the Extension Office by May 15.** It may only be returned electronically. Applicants are expected to read criteria and guidelines before applying. These may also be found on the web. The awards will be presented on Sunday afternoon of the Fond du Lac County Fair.

The Stephenson Scholarship Fund

The purpose of The Stephenson Scholarship Fund of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin is to assist students of Fond du Lac County, Wisconsin, in attaining or completing an education at any one of the University of Wisconsin campuses. All residents of Fond du Lac County are eligible to apply.

Scholarships will be awarded to students who have shown ambition to obtain further education. Those selected will not necessarily be to the most needy students financially, nor the most brilliant. Scholarships will be awarded only to full-time, undergraduate college students (incoming freshman through seniors in college). The total amount of the scholarships will be dependent upon monies available for distribution from the Stephenson Fund.

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$10,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin students pursuing higher education in 2019. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by **Friday, March 15, 2019, 5:00 pm.**

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance and future educational goals. To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships, students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least one year; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2019-2020 academic school year. State Fair Dairy Promotion Board Scholarships Available

The Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board is offering \$1,000 scholarships to be used during the second semester of the 2019-20 school year.

Third and fourth-year college students pursuing dairy-related or food science degrees at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities are eligible to apply. Additional scholarships will be available to high school seniors



planning to pursue a dairy-related or food science degree at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities or students studying in a two-year, technical school program related to dairy or food science.

Applicants will be evaluated on involvement and leadership in dairy-related activities, scholastic achievement, and career objectives. Finalists will be interviewed in mid-April, with the recipients to be recognized at the 2019 Wisconsin State Fair.

Poultry Project Fair Information

This year for fair entries, you will need to have official certificates to enter any poultry. All birds that are older than 4 months need to be tested. If you buy birds from a hatchery, your receipt will no longer be adequate for entering those birds. You will need to send the receipt to the state, and they will send you an official copy.

County Fair Swine Update: Changes in Initial Weigh-in & Show

No initial weigh-in for

2019: This year exhibitors wishing to identify their swine project for the Fond du Lac County Fair will be doing so via self-tagging and providing pictures of the hogs. Documentation for initial identification are due to UW-Extension by April 15th. Ear tags and information will be distributed at the annual Market Livestock Project Orientation Meeting on April 2nd.



Terminal swine show: Due to new state requirements regarding PRRS (porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome) testing, Fond du Lac County will be hosting a terminal swine show. All hogs shown at the county fair will be sent directly to slaughter (via processor or stockyards) immediately following the fair. Going to a terminal show will eliminate the need for exhibitors to test for PRRS (a \$75 fee) prior to the fair. Exhibitors are encouraged to find buyers for their non-sale hogs and make appointments for processing with local processors.




