RETURNING!!! Members may enter an additional category on food photography. This may be entered on its own or in connection with an entry in the contest. We also will be welcoming Festival Foods to the contest. They will have 10 fruits and vegetables, and 10 nuts and berries which you will be able to identify. This will serve as an introduction and practice contest for anyone interested in competing in the state plant identification contest. You do not have to enter the foods review to participate in this part of the program although pre-registration is appreciated to have ample supplies.

NEW THIS YEAR!!! Members will also be able to compete in a centerpiece category. The centerpiece will need to use either dried or silk material. This can be from the food portion of the contest or a separate entry. Entries may then also be entered at the state competition in connection with the plant identification contest.

You will make a food item from a category listed on page 8 using the Raspberry theme. You will set one place setting, to include a recipe card for the item made, placemat or tablecloth, and centerpiece.

Fond du Lac County 4-H Horse and Pony Project Offer Scholarship

Deadline for application is May 30. The scholarship recipient will be awarded during the Fond du Lac County Fair Horse project's potluck and awards evening. If there is only 1 qualified applicant, then 1 scholarship for \$400 will be awarded. If there are 2 or more qualified applicants, then 2 scholarships of \$300 each will be awarded. Members may only win the scholarship once.

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To qualify, the applicant must be a member in good standing of the Fond du Lac County 4-H Horse and Pony project. Applicant must be a current member of the project, and be a senior in High School, or in their first year of higher education. The applicant must be attending, or will be attending a technical college, college/university, farm & industry short course program, vocational college or training to further education in a specific field i.e. – farrier, saddle making, certificate program, etc. It does NOT have to be horse related. Incomplete or late application packets will not be accepted for consideration.

Area Animal Science Days (AASD)

Animal science educational opportunities are available to 4-H members. Area Animal Science Days is a series of daylong events held around the state in June where youth in the beef, dairy, horse, sheep, and swine projects increase their decision making skills and knowledge of animals through judging and grading experiences. Events include evaluation of dairy cattle, horses and meat animals; dairy showmanship contests; hippology (the study of horses); and oral reasons workshops. In addition, each site offers a variety of workshops for small animal projects, which may include rabbits, poultry, dogs, cats or llamas.

County Fair Jr. Dairy Show Update

The Fond du Lac County Fair has established a qualifying requirement to show dairy at the Fond du Lac County Fair. In order to qualify to show dairy at the fair, youth must attend a minimum of one fitting/showmanship workshop. Fitting/showmanship workshops or opportunities not listed on the "County Fair Activity Card" (must be pre-approved by a 4-H Dairy Project Committee Member." Opportunities to qualify include, but are not limited to:

- · Dairy Day of Learning
- FDL Jr. Holstein Fitting/Showmanship Workshop
- NASCO Fitting/Showmanship Clinic
- Animart Fitting Clinic
- Badger Dairy Camp
- Showmanship at a district, state or national show
- Club level-sponsored fitting/showmanship work shop (club leader must request pre-approval prior to meeting)

Those wishing to qualify for county fair must turn in a signed and completed "Activity Card" with their Dairy ID Sheets to the Fond du Lac County Fair by the entry deadline. Qualifying for Wisconsin State Fair Jr Dairy

The Wisconsin State Fair is an opportunity for youth 12 to 19 years of age as of January 1st to show dairy. Fond du Lac County dairy youth are selected through the 4-H Dairy Committee based on their participation in county-wide meeting events, volunteer service, and quality of their animal. In order to qualify to show at Wisconsin State Fair, youth must meet the following requirements:

- Must have shown dairy at the Fond du Lac County Fair the previous two years (including current year).
- Complete educational activities requirements:
 - Complete 2 hours of volunteer service
 - Attend a minimum of one fitting/showmanship workshop
 - Participate in a minimum of one dairy educational activity

Youth must have a "State Fair Activity Card" completed, signed, and submitted at the June meeting. Activity cards are located on the web at fyi.uwex.edu/fdldairyyouth/wi-state-fair/. Youth in their last year of showing are not required to fulfill the educational requirement. Activities not listed must be preapproved by a 4-H Dairy Project Committee Member. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Certification

Tuesday, May 28th—7 pm (all ages) LGI / UC-113/114, UW-Fond du Lac For other trainings or online training, please visit the <u>YQCA</u> website or complete training on-line.

YQCA is designed as an annual education and certification program focused on food safety, animal well-being and character awareness for youth ages 8 to 21 producing and/or showing pigs, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, market rabbits, and poultry. The program has been designed by Extension specialists and national livestock program managers to ensure it is accurate, current and relevant to the needs of the animal industry, shows, and is appropriate for youth.

YQCA is a requirement to be eligible to sell at the Fond du Lac County Fair Market Livestock Sale. Youth have the option to do the face-to-face training at any one of the YQCA trainings across the state or to do the on-line training.



Fees:

The program is designed to provide an estimated 60 minutes of education each year. The online program requires the passing of a series of three quizzes to earn certification. An inperson YQCA workshop requires complete attendance.

There is a fee for the program this year, and must be paid directly to YQCA at time of registration via credit card. The fee is \$3 per person for a face-to-face training. For those wishing to do the online training at any time or anywhere, there is a \$12 fee. None of the fee comes back to Fond du Lac County. One hundred percent of the fee is used by YQCA to develop curriculum and web-based resources.

- 6. Foods Revue displays shall consist of the food(s), the recipe on a 3"x 5" or 4" x 6" card, a place setting, a place mat or tablecloth, and centerpiece.
- 7. Each participant is expected to answer questions pertaining to the project work.
- 8. Participants may use 4-H project books, favorite family recipes, or recipes from other sources.
- Garnishes are acceptable and encouraged for all entries
- 10. Cloverbud will receive ribbons; all others will receive premiums and ribbons. Premiums will be on their fair check that is distributed after the fair. Additional prizes may be also presented as determined by the Foods Revue Committee. Remember to enter this item when you do your on-line fair entry.
- 11. All participants are asked to bring at least 25 sample size portions of their recipe to serve during the Taste of Fond du Lac 4-H portion of the evening.
- 12. All entries must follow the 2019 theme and contain **RASPBERRIES** in the recipe.

Completing Your Fair Entries

The rules and regulations for exhibiting at the Fond du Lac County Fair are in the 2019/2020 Fair Book, which will be posted soon online at www.fonddulaccountyfair.com under the *Exhibitors* tab. Stall fees, judging schedules, and the online entry portal link can also be found on this webpage. Please be sure to read all rules and regulations.

Attention all 4-H members - Jr. Exhibitor fee is \$5.00. Exhibitors can upgrade to a season pass for an additional \$10.00. This pass is good for all grandstand events excluding the music concerts. When completing your fair entries, be sure that you are entered in the correct department, correct division and correct class number. If you are unsure, please check with your project leader or general leader. The open class exhibitor fee is \$20.00. Open class exhibitors can upgrade for an additional \$20 which includes parking and all grandstand events excluding the music concerts. All entries must be submitted online via the website. The online entry portal will open Monday, May 14th. All of the projects that can be entered are preformatted in the system in an easy to use point and click format. Payments can be made online, however, due to increased processing fees, a \$2.00 processing fee will be charged at the time entries are submitted. Payment can also be made when entry tags are picked up at the Fair Office by credit card, check or cash. No processing fee will be charged if paying at the office. The system will send a confirmation email once the entries have been accepted. If you do not receive a confirmation email, your entry did not go through!! If you are uncomfortable using the internet or do not have internet access, you may enter in person at the Fair Office beginning June 3rd.

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Important deadlines for your fair entry forms include:

Saturday, June 15th - Entries must be submitted online by 11:59 pm. If you need help at the fair office on June 15th, the office will only be open until noon. Monday June 24th to Saturday June 28th - pick-up fair entry tags at the County Fair Office. Wednesday, July 3rd— deadline to submit entry tag corrections to the County Fair Office by 4:30pm. The Fair Office will be closed Wednesday, July 4th - 6th. If you have any questions, please contact Bridget Schaumberg at 920.960.1629 prior to June and the Fair Office at 920.929.3168 after June or

office@fonddulaccountyfair.com anytime. Please do not contact the Extension Office with fair-related questions. Lastly, if you have any special needs, please notify the Fair Office.

Online Fair Entry Tips

- Enter through the Fond du Lac County Fair website at <u>www.fonddulaccountyfair.com</u>, not through 4Honline.
- When you enter on-line, you are merely entering an item for exhibit. You will also need to view the online fair premium list as this gives schedules and rules.
- Many departments include a class that says 'item made in school' or 'any other item'. When you are entering these types of classes, double check that you are in the correct department. For instance, if you intend to enter an art exhibit, make sure you are under art - any other item and not under woodworking - any other item.
- Look through the premium book and write down on paper all the department names and numbers, divisions, class names, and numbers that you want to enter. Use this as a reference when doing the actual online entries.
- When making entries online, do it with another person to check accuracy of information.
- You will get an email confirmation of your entries. If you do not get the confirmation, your entry was not submitted. When you get the confirmation, check it for accuracy. If corrections need to be made, contact the fair office. Ask another person to review the confirmation. Fresh eyes may catch an incorrect entry.

Then continue with payment information. Each exhibitor must pay at least a \$5 entry fee. Those exhibiting animals may have additional fees.

Seeking Fairest of the Fair Contestants

The 2019 Fond du Lac County Fair is looking for qualified Fairest of the Fair contestants. The Fairest of the Fair will be the ambassador for the fair. He or she will be asked to attend various events to promote the fair and its many functions and events. The Fairest is expected to attend all five days of the fair and be on hand for impromptu appearances as needed. Additionally, the Fairest will compete for the State Fairest of the Fair crown at the Wisconsin Association of Fairs State Convention held in January of 2020. Contestants must be 18 or over as of January 1 of the current year. He or she must have been a resident of Fond du Lac County for at least one year or be an active member of a Fond du Lac County youth organization involved in exhibiting at the Fond du Lac County Fair. The Fairest of the Fair will be crowned on Saturday, June 1st prior to the Fond du lac County Fair. Contestants will be judged wearing business professional attire. Judging on the county level will be based on the following qualifications: personality, poise, appearance, community involvement, speaking ability, and a 30-second public service announcement. To apply, contestants need to fill out an entry form which is available at www.fonddulaccountyfair.com/p/ getinvolved/fairest-of-the-fair on the bottom of the page or by contacting Tiffany Venne at 920.979.0508. Application deadline is May 8th.

Stall Fees for Horseless Horse

Everyone entering in the horseless horse project is required to pay a stall fee of \$1.50. Horseless horse entries should list whose horse the exhibitor will be using.

Combining Clubs for Herdsmanship

Clubs, that have only one or two members exhibiting under an animal project, may join together and display their animals under one decoration and share barn duties. This combined display will be judged as one exhibit for herdsmanship, and thus only one placing/ prize would be awarded. Project/ fair superintendents need to be informed of this combination of clubs before the fair, so that the stall/pen assignments can be located together.

Dairy I.D.s Due June 15th

This is a reminder that Dairy ID forms are due June 15th to the Fair Office by noon or postmarked by June 15th. ID forms must be submitted for every dairy animal shown at the county and state fair. Please give a short animal name under each description (Example: fall heifer calf - Josie). If you are going to exhibit the same animal as last year, those ID forms submitted last year can be picked up at the Fair Office. Family ID forms are still permitted. ID forms can be found on the website. Although our system does not allow for these ID's to be submitted online, they can be faxed to the Fair Office at 920.906.6308, emailed to the fair at office@fonddulaccountyfair.com, mailed to the Fair at PO Box 1466, Fond du Lac WI 54936, or dropped off at the Fair Office during normal business hours.

Premise I.D. for Most Animal Species Must be Included on Fair Forms

The following animals need to have a premise I.D: bison, cattle, horses, donkeys, mules, goats, sheep, swine, poultry (chickens, turkeys, geese, ducks, guinea fowl, and squab), game birds (pheasants, quail, wild turkeys, migratory fowl, pigeons, and exotic birds), elk, moose, reindeer, musk deer, llamas, alpacas, rheas, ostriches, emus, cassowary, kiwi and fish farms. Please make sure to have the Premise Number I.D. handy when entering any of these species as the online entry system will request it.
