- 2024-2025 4-H Enrollment There will not be a shutdown with 4HOnline this year. As soon as the system performs year-end and rolls over our data to the new year, families can go in and start re-enrolling. The system processing shouldn't take much time at all, so starting after Sept 1, the system will be ready to start accepting re-enrollments.
- Charter Application The 2024-2025 4-H Charter Application is now available on the Wisconsin 4-H Charter Application website: https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/resources/volunteer-resources/administrative/charter/. Clubs will have the opportunity to work on the new charter at the 4-H Fall Kick-off. This new version of the 4-H Charter Application has been converted into an online format, making the process easier. With just a few clicks and no signatures needed, you can complete the online form in less than 15 minutes! Ask your club or group leader how you can work together to plan

for the 4-H year. Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups Charter Applications are submitted online and **due by November 1, 2024**. If you have questions, please contact Tracy Keifenheim.

• Annual Financial Report: Checking or Savings Accounts for 4-H Clubs and Groups*

All 4-H Clubs and Groups that have a checking and/or savings account must complete the Articles of Organization and have an Employee Identification Number before any accounts can be opened.

In addition, 4-H Clubs and Groups that have a checking and/or savings account must annually complete and submit the following documents to the 4-H Program Educator by **September 1**:

- 1. Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Annual Financial Report
- 2. Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Audit Checklist
- 3. A copy of the checkbook and/or savings registry covering July 1 June 30
- 4. A copy of the bank statement ending June 30 or July 1 for each account. Any differences between the bank statement(s) and the ending balance reported must be reconciled and the reconciliation must be uploaded with the Annual Financial Report.
- 5. A current <u>inventory</u> of land, buildings, property, or project equipment with individual values of \$1,000 or greater.
- 6. Monthly Treasurer's Reports for 4-H Clubs or Groups with annual income greater or equal to \$20,000.

This process allows the 4-H Club or Group to qualify for federal tax-exempt status under the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents General Exemption Number (GEN) for Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups. Failure to submit a completed Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Annual Financial Report and supporting documents by the due date could result in loss of tax-exempt status and forfeiture of all financial assets.

- On occasion, we have received requests for a **certificate of insurance**. This often happens because 4-H is using someone else's facilities (i.e. school, church) and the facility wants proof there is insurance coverage. Contact Tracy and provide the following information:
 - What is the event
 - The date of the event
 - Location/address of the event
 - The name, address, and e-mail of the person to send the certificate to

We will send this information to the UW-Madison risk manager. They will send the certificate to me. You need to allow plenty of time for this chain to be followed when asking for a certificate. We suggest a

minimum of three weeks for process time. Separate certificates are needed for each location of an event.

This training will be held virtually in person in all three locations (choose the location best for you, doesn't have to be in your respective county). A minimum of 10 participants will be required for the training to be held. Registration is required three days before the date of the session. - The **County Achievement Program** is Sunday, November 3, at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds EXPO Center at 12 pm. More details to come, please save the date.
- Record Books and award nominations are due to the Extension Office by Sept. 3. Electronic forms are e-mailed to leaders for you to complete and e-mail back. One form is for nominations for project, career, and Kiwanis awards. The other form is for gold, silver, bronze, and honor. Reading of record books will be on Saturday, September 7, starting at 8:30 am in room 205/206 of Admin/Extension Building at Fond du Lac County Campus (FCC). Each club is expected to have at least one representative. Larger clubs should have more. If the person cannot be there by 8:30 am, ask them to come as soon as possible. This person may be a parent or registered leader. An explanation of the record book review process will be done that day. Prior experience is not needed. Lunch will be provided, so it would be greatly appreciated if you would let the office know by Tuesday, September 3 how many people will be present from your club.
- Community Service Awards for Clubs and Individuals Service to the community is a fundamental principle of 4-H. We will recognize individual youth and clubs who have taken leadership in 4-H community service efforts. Up to two youth in grades 5 8 and up to two youth in grades 9 12 (grades are based on the grade the child was in at the start of the 4-H year, October 1, 2023) will be recognized at the Annual 4-H Achievement Program. Top placing clubs submitting applications will be recognized. Recognition will be given in two categories: large and small clubs. Top placing clubs will have funds donated by the Fond du Lac County 4-H Leader Association in their club's name, to the agency for which the club did community service. Applications are due to the Extension Office by September 3.

Citizenship, Leadership, & 4-H Growth Achievement Awards - Citizenship, Leadership, and 4-H Growth Achievement awards may be earned by members who have completed ninth grade or above. Members may either be self-nominated or nominated by their leader. It is a short application and needs two recommendations. Applications are due to the Extension Office by September 15. Recipients will be announced at the county achievement program. Apply for the 2024 4-H Key Award - The Key Award is the highest state 4-H award earned by members who have shown consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in their 4-H club and community. Youth in grades 11-13 are eligible to apply. Up to five recipients from Fond du Lac County can be selected. To be eligible for an award, you must turn in a completed **application by September 15** and interview. You can find the application at https://fonddulac.extension.wisc.edu/4h/travel-experiences-a/. Details on other opportunities can also be found on the website listed above.

Nominate 4-H Volunteers and Supporting Businesses for Recognition - Each year at the annual banquet, 4-H volunteers, alumni, and businesses that support 4-H are recognized for their contributions. A nomination form is <u>found online here</u> or at the Extension Office. Simply list the nominee and provide brief information about why you are nominating them. Past recipients for each of these awards are found on the 4-H website at https://fonddulac.extension.wisc.edu/4h/awards-scholarships/#volunteer under 4-H Volunteer Awards. A committee reviews and makes the final selections. Any 4-H member, parent, or leader may make nominations. Forms are due Sept 15. This is a special way to thank the volunteer who has made a difference.

• 4-H Clubs are asked to Present Flags at County Board Meetings - Fond du Lac County 4-H clubs have the opportunity to participate in the flag presentation at the beginning of a county board meeting. Ledgers 4-H has been participating at each June meeting for the past few years. The County Board would like to see more 4-H clubs involved in this. The meetings are generally held on a Tuesday. The meetings begin at 6:00 pm. One member would carry in the American flag, another member the WI flag, and possibly another for the 4-H flag. You would lead the pledge of allegiance, and you can stay for the county board meeting or leave after the pledge. If any clubs are interested in the flag presentation, please contact Josh Boyenga at Joshua.Boyenga@fdlco.wi.gov by November 25. Send him the months that would work for your club. You will know in January what month you will be a presenter. Because Fond du Lac County is a strong supporter of 4-H, it would be fitting to have 4-H present at the board meetings. Please seriously consider responding to this request. It takes just two youth, but more are welcome to walk in together.
