Summer Camp Update - There will be different day camp programs offered this summer. We are seeking volunteers who would like to be part of the 2025 Day Camp Committee. If you know of individuals who would be a great fit for Cloverbud Day Camp, Art Day Camp, LEGO Camp, Foodie Camp, STEM Camp, Around the World Camp, or Cardboard Day Camp opportunities for the summer of 2025, please contact Tracy at tracy.keifenheim@wisc.edu. The planning for many of these opportunities is done over the next couple of months. Youth can start signing up for day camps in 4Honline on April 15.

(NEW) Around the World Camp - Grab your passports and pack your bags to travel with us around the world. Play sports or geography games, listen to music, create cultural crafts, and enjoy traditional foods. Youth will have the opportunity to visit one country in the morning and one country in the afternoon to collect 6 passport stamps in total. Youth may also learn some vocabulary from the different countries. Grades 3rd-8th.

Cloverbud Day Camp is a camp for youth from grades Kindergarten to 2nd. This camp focuses on a topic for the youth to explore. The camp runs from 9 am-3 pm at UWO Fond du Lac Campus. Topics include Buzz, Flutter, Crawl, STEM, and Teddy Bear Adventures. We are seeking volunteers who would like to help plan the camp as well as volunteer during camp to help the counselors.

Cardboard Day Camp is a multi-day camp for youth in grades 3rd-8th, where youth engineer cardboard creations and participate in team building and leadership exercises under the leadership of counselors. Youth will design a city and use their design to build a model. Youth will construct the model using various materials such as cardboard boxes, paper towel tubes, paper plates, and more. Youth will work as a team to complete a challenge! The camp runs from 9 am -12 pm at UWO Fond du Lac Campus. The goal of this effort is to engage young people in leadership roles while learning about science, technology, math, and engineering.

Art Day Camp is a camp for youth to learn different art skills. We are seeking volunteers and youth to be part of this camp planning committee and to help run the camp. The camp will be 3 days, and each day will focus on a different art media. The committee decides the format of the camp. Topics covered are Art-Rageous 2-D Camp, Super Sculptures 3-D Camp, and Creative Cultural Arts. The art projects are some of the most popular projects youth enroll in. Foodie Camp is a camp for youth to learn different cooking and baking skills. We are seeking volunteers and youth to be part of this camp planning committee and to help run the camp. The Foods

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and Nutrition project is one of the most popular projects youth enroll in. LEGO Camp is a camp for youth to learn different LEGO building skills. The LEGO club and project is growing fast. Join us during this camp and get a taste of what LEGO club is like! Youth will build different creations with the LEGO bricks at the office. No need to bring any from home! Youth will also learn about different building and engineering techniques, as well as doing some LEGO crafts they can take home! This camp is running in the afternoons opposite of Cardboard camp. Grades 3rd-8th.

STEM CSI Camp - Are you ready to dive into the thrilling world of crime scene investigation? Join us for an action-packed, three-day STEM CSI Camp designed for curious minds in grades 3rd-8th. This camp is perfect for young detectives who love solving mysteries and exploring the fascinating science behind crime-solving. Youth will participate in hands-on activities such as fingerprinting, learning how to crack codes, and other techniques to examine evidence. At the end of the camp, they'll have the chance to solve a mini crime scene! Don't miss out on this unique opportunity to become a junior CSI agent!

Youth will be able to choose from SPARK tracks to learn what it takes to have a career or hobby in a field that fits them the best. These tracks are:

- **Agriculture & Animal Sciences**: Explore agriculture and animal sciences with facility tours and hands-on experiences in dairy, livestock, meat science, food science, veterinary science, plants, and more.
- **Baking & Decorating**: Learn the basics (reading a recipe, scaling ingredients, evaluating for doneness, decorating) while gaining confidence that leads to self-sufficiency while exploring career opportunities in baking and decorating.
- Civic Engagement Through Local Leadership and Community Design: Our track will help you reimagine your community and work to develop a plan that can build the community you want to be a part of now into the future. We want you to be able to not just imagine yourself in local leadership but provide tools so you can make it happen.
- **Performing Arts**: Get creative while developing your performance skill through sessions in disciplines like Theater. Dance and Music.
- **Skilled Construction Trades**: Explore a rewarding career in the skilled construction trades with this hands-on educational opportunity! Participants will gain experience in carpentry, plumbing, and electrical work through interactive activities led by industry professionals. Participants will also learn about registered apprenticeship programs, the most common form of training in the skilled trades industry. Don't miss your chance to build, wire, and plumb your way to new opportunities!
- **The Transportation Experience**: Be ready to experience a transportation career while working with technical college staff and industry professionals to practice industry repairs and experience the

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transportation industry with some fun competition along the way. You will explore the various systems with hands-on activities including creating electrical circuits, using power tools (and a variety of other tools) to disassemble and reassemble components, and learn about components of a variety of vehicles.

- Visual Arts: Exploring the depths of what it means to be an Artist: Youth will work with artists to develop
 their creative skills and build a deeper understanding of some of the applications of art as a critical part of
 any culture.
- **The Water Quest**: Explore how researchers study the health of Wisconsin waterways using analytical methods and observation. Be introduced to invasive species detection methods, understand the importance of healthy waterways and be exposed to careers in the field.

Idea Studio makerspace at the Fond du Lac Public Library

The Idea Studio is a makerspace -- a permanent do-it-yourself zone where people can gather to create, invent, and learn. It includes work tables, laptops, equipment, and projects, and is open to anyone age 13 and older. Children under 13 are welcome if accompanied by a parent or caretaker.

Some equipment is available for use without prior training, whereas other equipment requires a user to first become "badged" before use. All users of the space are expected to follow safe use practices, clean up after themselves, and respect the space and its other users. There is no fee for use of equipment, but some have fees for supplies, or require users to bring their own supplies. Further details are available here, and are provided during badging.
