Dear 4-H Leader,

• 2024-2025 4-H Enrollment - Families can enroll in 4HOnline for this year. Included in this mailing is a list of your club's current membership based on who has enrolled in 4-H online. The re-enrollment deadline is October 31! Reminder: Youth wishing to show in the JR show at the fair must be enrolled in an approved youth organization by 2/1 of the fair year. Note that this is to show. If they are not enrolled, they cannot show at all. This is a Fond du Lac County Fair Policy.

Last year we had over 525 youth and 150 adult volunteers; let's see if we can beat that! We are **currently at 510 youth members and 57 volunteers**. **Over 100 members** have **not re-enrolled** as of Friday, November 1, 2024.

• The fall annual **Adult Leaders Association Meeting** will be held **6:30 pm Wednesday**, **November 6** at Fond du Lac County Campus. The association will be holding elections of board members and will discuss plans for the 2023-2024 4-H year. Districts up for election are **District 3 and District 5**. District 3 rep is Cindy Holzman who has only served 1 term, so she is eligible to run again. *Clubs in district 3 are Busy Bees*, **Green Valley, Hands of Friendship or County**. District 5 rep is Deb Senn, who is currently serving her 2nd term and wouldn't be eligible to run again. *Clubs in district 5 are Armstrong, Campbellsport, Welcome or County*. Please keep that in mind for the next Adult Leaders Meeting.

ALL adult leaders and youth are invited to attend. Please mark your calendar for this important date. Also if you do not have your required trainings completed for volunteer enrollment, we will do this at the beginning of the meeting!

- Club Bylaws As the 4-H Educator for Fond du Lac County I need to review and approve by-laws, policies, and handbooks for all 4-H Clubs, 4-H Groups, and 4-H Associations before they are voted on. Bylaws and policies should be reviewed annually by club members and all changes or additions voted on. New members should be given copies and expectations shared when joining a Club, Group, or Association. A copy of the most recent bylaws should be submitted to the office by **November 1**st. If you have recently updated them and there is no change please let the office no, so we can check that we have the most updated copy on file. - On occasion, we have received requests for a **certificate of insurance**. This often happens because a 4-H club or group is using someone else's facilities (i.e. school, church), and the facility wants proof there is insurance coverage. Contact Tracy and provide the following information:
 - What is the event
 - The date of the event
 - Location/address of the event
 - The name, address, and e-mail of the person to send the certificate to

We will send this information to the UW-Madison risk manager. They will send the certificate to me. You need to allow plenty of time for this chain to be followed when asking for a certificate. We suggest a **minimum of 3** weeks for process time. Separate certificates are needed for each location of an event.

Holiday Parades

With the Holiday parade season around the corner, please take time to read through the Wisconsin 4-H Parade Policy. The policy can be found at the link below. Wisconsin 4-H is committed to providing safe and healthy environments for youth and adults participating in 4-H programs and activities. Preparing floats and participating in parades can be a fun way to promote 4-H, AND there are risks associated with these activities. 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FINAL.pdf) outlines expectations for managing risk associated with vehicles used in parades, as well as youth and adults riding on vehicles or walking in the parade. An email with instructions for completing the survey online will be **sent directly to the 4-H members' addresses in 4-H Online**. Any potentially identifying information will be removed and not released publicly. The individual answers that the youth provide will be kept confidential. We are hopeful that youth will participate in this important evaluation. There is no requirement to complete the survey, and it will not affect their 4-H membership. Please encourage youth ages 13-19 to participate. The survey will be sent to all Wisconsin 4-H members by e-mail in **early November**. Youth who complete the survey will be entered into a raffle to win a \$25 gift card!
