Dear 4-H Leader.

The Extension Office is moving! During the week of October 27-31, staff and educators are working remotely while we move offices and equipment to the new location. Please contact us via email during this time. During the month of November, we will be working to unpack and get things in place so responses may take longer than usual. Please call the office to make an appointment at 920-906-4623. An Open House will be held on Monday, November 17th from 2-4pm so you can stop in and see the new space in the Fond du Lac County Government Center at 160 South Macy St on the second floor. When coming to the new office, you will need to park in the north parking lot and come through security, then take the elevator in the lobby to the 2nd floor.

2025-2026 4-H Enrollment - ALL current 4-H members and adult volunteers MUST re-enroll in order to be active in the new year through 4HOnline. Included in this mailing is a list of your club's current membership based on who has enrolled in 4-H online. Returning volunteers must complete enrollment by November 1st and complete training and background checks by December 1st. Please contact the office at 920-906-4623 if you need any help with enrolling or completing the training or background check. Youth wishing to show at the fair must be enrolled in an approved youth organization by February 1st of the fair year. This is a Fond du Lac County Fair Policy. Last year we had 605 youth and 142 adult volunteers; let's see if we can beat that! We are currently at 309 youth members and 58 volunteers. Thank you for all you do for the young people in Fond du Lac County. Thank you for your volunteer leadership!

The fall annual <u>Adult Leaders Association Meeting</u> will be held 6:30 pm Thursday, November 6 at Fond du Lac County Campus. The association will be holding elections of board members and will discuss plans for the 2025-2026 4-H year. Districts up for election are 1 and 4. **District 1** rep is Yvonne Greenfield and she has decided to not run for another term. **District 1** needs a nomination from the following clubs: Alto All Stars, Brandon Tanagers, or a County Leader. Jennifer Ladwig is the current district 4 Rep and is not eligible to rerun as she has served 2 consecutive terms. **District 4** needs a nomination from the following clubs: Helping Hands, South Byron or a County Leader. Please keep that in mind for the next Adult Leaders Meeting. ALL adult leaders and youth are invited to attend. **Please mark your calendar for this important date- November 6.**

<u>Club Bylaws</u> - As the 4-H Educator for Fond du Lac County I need to review and approve by-laws, policies, and handbooks for all 4-H Clubs, 4-H Groups, and 4-H Associations before they are voted on. Bylaws and policies should be reviewed annually by club members and all changes or additions voted on. New members should be given copies and expectations shared when joining a Club, Group, or Association. A copy of the most recent bylaws should be submitted to the office by **November 1**st. If you have recently updated them and there is no change please let the office know, so we can check that we have the most updated copy on file. <u>Holiday Parades</u> - With Holiday parade season around the corner, please take time to read through the Wisconsin 4-H Parade Policy. Wisconsin 4-H is committed to providing safe and healthy environments for youth and adults participating in 4-H programs and activities. Preparing floats and participating in parades can be a fun way to promote 4-H, AND there are risks associated with these activities. The <u>4-H Parades Policy</u> outlines expectations for managing risk associated with vehicles used in parades, as well as youth and adults riding on vehicles or walking in the parade. <u>4-H Thriving Model</u> - Wisconsin 4-H is inviting members (ages 13-18) to complete a survey about their 4-H experience. The information will help show how 4-H helps young people to learn new things, develop leadership skills, manage goals, set high personal standards, create positive academic attitudes, and other skills that lead to long-term success in life. An email with instructions for completing the survey online will be sent directly to the 4-H members' addresses in 4-H Online in early November. Any potentially identifying information will be removed and not released publicly. The individual answers that the youth provide will be kept confidential. There is no requirement to complete the survey, and it will not affect their 4-H membership. Please encourage youth ages 13-19 to participate. Youth who complete the survey will be entered into a raffle to win a \$25 gift card!
